Mission Statement

Funded Councils are University recognized student organizations that receive ASI funding and are a part of the ASI Executive Senate. The ASI Executive Senate is composed of the leadership of all student-run councils and programs that ASI funds. The purpose of the Executive Senate is to provide a line of communication between the leadership of the ASI and the various student-led programs and councils that it funds. The ASI Executive Senate is also a resource for programs and councils, assisting them in their activities, and a means to encourage cooperation and collaboration among the groups.

Program Overview

There are seven funded councils that serve as part of the ASI Executive Senate. These University recognized councils receive funding from the ASI to provide programs and events for the students of Cal State Fullerton. Many of these councils are composed of University recognized student clubs.

Funded Council Events

During the Fall 2012 semester, the Black Student Union did not sponsor any events. In the Spring 2013 semester, the Black Student Union sponsored 4 events and averaged 90 students per event. The Black Student Union was established this year and therefore this has been the first year they have sponsored events.

During the Fall 2012 semester, Interfraternity Council sponsored 2 events and averaged 362.5 students per event. In the Spring 2013 semester, Interfraternity Council did not sponsor any events. The figure for the Fall semester reflects a 106.5 students per event increase from the previous Fall semester.

During the Fall 2012 semester, Mesa Cooperativa sponsored 5 events and averaged 540 students per event. In the Spring 2013 semester, Mesa Cooperativa sponsored 2 events and averaged 167.5 students per event. These averages reflect 155 and 69.17 students per event increases from the previous Fall and Spring semesters, respectively.

During the Fall 2012 semester, the Multi-Cultural Greek Council/National Pan-Hellenic Council sponsored 6 events and averaged 43.33 students per event. In the Spring 2013 semester, the Multi-Cultural Greek Council/National Pan-Hellenic Council sponsored 10 events and averaged 47 students per event. These averages reflect 18.42 and 23.43 students per event decreases from the previous Fall and Spring semesters, respectively.

During the Fall 2012 semester, the Panhellenic Council sponsored 2 events and averaged 580 students per event. In the Spring 2013 semester, the Panhellenic Council sponsored 1 event that had 650 students in attendance. These averages reflect 201.5 and 623 students per event increases from the previous Fall and Spring semesters, respectively.

During the Fall 2012 semester, the Resident Student Association sponsored 4 events and averaged 73.75 students per event. In the Spring 2013 semester, the Resident Student Association sponsored 3 events and averaged 241 students per event. The figure for the Fall semester reflects a 32.45 students per event decrease from the previous Fall semester. The figure for the Spring semester reflects a 155.58 students per event increase from the previous Spring semester.

Funded Council Travel

During the 2012-2013 program year, the Interfraternity Council funded travel for 3 students and averaged \$36.76 in travel funds per student.

During the 2012-2013 program year, Mesa Cooperativa funded travel for 19 students and averaged \$193.43 in travel funds per student.

During the 2012-2013 program year, the Multi-Cultural Greek Council/National Pan-Hellenic Council funded travel for 7 students and averaged \$36.76 in travel funds per student.

During the 2012-2013 program year, the Panhellenic Council funded travel for 7 students and averaged \$39.64 in travel funds per student.

During the 2012-2013 program year, the Resident Student Association funded travel for 7 students and averaged \$445.67 in travel funds per student.

During the 2012-2013 program year, 5 students were allocated funding for travel from ASI Contingency and this averaged \$500.00 in travel funds per student.

Travel data was not compiled last year, therefore, there is no data to compare it to.
