Mission Statement

Funded Councils are University recognized student organizations that receive ASI funding and are a part of the ASI Executive Senate. The ASI Executive Senate is composed of the leadership of all student-run councils and programs that ASI funds. The purpose of the Executive Senate is to provide a line of communication between the leadership of the ASI and the various student-led programs and councils that it funds. The Executive Senate is also a resource for programs and councils, assisting them in their activities, and a means to encourage cooperation and collaboration among the groups.

Program Overview

There are seven funded councils that serve as part of the ASI Executive Senate. These University recognized councils receive funding from the ASI to provide programs and events for the students of Cal State Fullerton. Many of these councils are composed of University recognized student clubs.

During the Fall 2008 and Spring 2009 semesters, the Council of Honor Societies did not sponsored any events.

During the Fall 2008 semester, the Interfraternity Council sponsored 3 events and averaged 66.67 students per event. In the Spring 2009 semester, the Interfraternity Council sponsored 1 event that had 600 students in attendance. The figure for the Fall semester reflects a 20.83 students per event decrease from the previous Fall semester. No events were sponsored by the Interfraternity Council in the previous Spring semester.

During the Fall 2008 semester, Mesa Cooperativa sponsored 5 events and averaged 264.2 students per event. In the Spring 2009 semester, Mesa Cooperativa sponsored 2 events and averaged 500 students per event. These averages reflect 147.42 and 350 students per event increases from the previous Fall and Spring semesters, respectively.

During the Fall 2008 semester, the Multi-Cultural Greek Council sponsored 3 events and averaged 66.67 students per event. In the Spring 2009 semester, the Multi-Cultural Greek Council sponsored 3 events and averaged 96.67 students per event. The figure for the Fall semester reflects a 14.42 students per event increase from the previous Fall semester. No events were sponsored in the previous Spring semester.

During the Fall 2008 semester, the National Pan-Hellenic Council sponsored 2 events and averaged 90 students per event. In the Spring 2009 semester, the National Pan-Hellenic Council sponsored 1 event that had 70 students in attendance. The figure for the Fall semester reflects a 40 students per event increase from the previous Fall semester. No events were sponsored in the previous Spring semester.

During the Fall 2008 semester, Panhellenic sponsored 2 events and averaged 512.5 students per event. In the Spring 2009 semester, Panhellenic sponsored 1 event that had 600 students in attendance. The figure for the Fall semester reflects a 139.9 students per event increase from the previous Fall semester. No events were sponsored in the previous Spring semester.

During the Fall 2008 semester, the Resident Student Association sponsored 3 events and averaged 101 students per event. In the Spring 2009 semester, the Resident Student Association sponsored 6 events and averaged 123.33 students per event. The figure for the Fall semester reflects a .05 students per event decrease from the previous Fall semester. The figure for the Spring semester reflects a 24.71 students per event increase from the previous Spring semester.
