Mission Statement

Inter-Club Councils (ICCs) are university recognized councils that receive funding from ASI. These councils are a part of the ASI Executive Senate. The ASI Executive Senate is composed of the leadership of all student-run councils and programs that ASI funds. The purpose of the Executive Senate is to provide a line of communication between the leadership of the ASI and these programs and councils.

Program Overview

There are ten ICCs that receive ASI funding; one in each of the eight academic colleges, the Community Service Inter-Club Council and the Sports Club Inter-Club Council. These councils help facilitate the allocation of ASI money to clubs and organizations for programs, speakers and student conference travel. Each council is composed of university recognized clubs and organizations.

Results Summary

Inter-Club Council Events

During the Fall 2012 semester, the Arts Inter-Club Council sponsored 8 events and averaged 36.75 students per event. In the Spring 2013 semester, the Arts Inter-Club Council sponsored 14 events and averaged 77.14 students per event. These averages reflect 239.42 and 0.36 students per event decreases from the previous Fall and Spring semesters, respectively.

During the Fall 2012 semester, the Business Inter-Club Council sponsored 16 events and averaged 61.25 students per event. In the Spring 2013 semester, the Business Inter-Club Council sponsored 28 events and averaged 46.68 students per event. These averages reflect a 21.53 students per event increase and 13.35 students per event decrease from the previous Fall and Spring semesters, respectively.

During the Fall 2012 semester, the Communications Inter-Club Council sponsored 13 events and averaged 61.23 students per event. In the Spring 2013 semester, the Communications Inter-Club Council sponsored 16 events and averaged 75.38 students per even. These averages reflect a 19.22 students per event decrease and 15.59 students per event increase from the previous Fall and Spring semesters, respectively.

During the Fall 2012 semester, the Community Service Inter-Club Council sponsored 2 events and averaged 25.5 students per event. In the Spring 2013 semester, the Community Service Inter-Club Council sponsored 2 events and averaged 48.5 students per event. These averages reflect 19.5 and 195.25 students per event decreases from the previous Fall and Spring semesters, respectively.

During the Fall 2012 semester, the Education Inter-Club Council sponsored 2 events and averaged 56 students per event. In the Spring 2013 semester, the Education Inter-Club Council sponsored 3 events and averaged 120 students per event. These averages reflect 13.5 and 95 students per event increases from the previous Fall and Spring semesters, respectively.

During the Fall 2012 semester, the ECS Inter-Club Council sponsored 2 events and averaged 1222.5 students per event. In the Spring 2013 semester, the ECS Inter-Club Council sponsored 2 events and averaged 192.5 students per event. These averages reflect 1214 and 178.94 students per event increases from the previous Fall and Spring semesters, respectively.

During the Fall 2012 semester, the HHD Inter-Club Council sponsored 6 events and averaged 64 students per event. In the Spring 2013 semester, the HHD Inter-Club Council sponsored 2 events and averaged 156.5 students per event. These averages reflect a 4 students per event increase and 193.5 students per event decrease from the previous Fall and Spring semesters, respectively.

During the Fall 2012 semester, the HSS Inter-Club Council sponsored 4 events and averaged 130 students per event. In the Spring 2013 semester, the HSS Inter-Club Council sponsored one event that had 310 students in attendance. These averages reflect 11.83 and 187.22 students per event increases from the previous Fall and Spring semesters, respectively.



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During the Fall 2012 semester, the NSM Inter-Club Council sponsored 4 events and averaged 22 students per event. In the Spring 2013 semester, the NSM Inter-Club Council sponsored 9 events and averaged 73 students per event. The figure for the Spring semester reflects a 227 students per event decrease from the previous Spring semester. No events were sponsored in the previous Fall semester.

During the Fall 2012 semester, the Sports Club Inter-Club Council sponsored 3 events and averaged 72 students per event. In the Spring 2013 semester, the Sports Club Inter-Club Council sponsored one event that had 200 students in attendance. These averages reflect 125 and 202 students per event decreases from the previous Fall and Spring semesters, respectively.

Inter-Club Council Travel

During the 2012-2013 program year, the Arts Inter-Club Council funded travel for 19 students and averaged \$56.84 in travel funds per student.

During the 2012-2013 program year, the Business Inter-Club Council funded travel for 61 students and averaged \$201.84 in travel funds per student.

During the 2012-2013 program year, the Communications Inter-Club Council funded travel for 42 students and averaged \$213.01 in travel funds per student.

During the 2012-2013 program year, the Community Service Inter-Club Council funded travel for 35 students and averaged \$110.00 in travel funds per student.

During the 2012-2013 program year, the Education Inter-Club Council funded travel for 9 students and averaged \$346.84 in travel funds per student.

During the 2012-2013 program year, the ECS Inter-Club Council funded travel for 72 students and averaged \$239.99 in travel funds per student.

During the 2012-2013 program year, the HHD Inter-Club Council funded travel for 4 students and averaged \$362.50 in travel funds per student.

During the 2012-2013 program year, the HSS Inter-Club Council funded travel for 51 students and averaged \$298.58 in travel funds per student.

During the 2012-2013 program year, the NSM Inter-Club Council funded travel for 39 students and averaged \$341.34 in travel funds per student.

During the 2012-2013 program year, the Sports Club Inter-Club Council funded travel for 25 students and averaged \$305.27 in travel funds per student.

Travel data was not compiled last year, therefore, there is no data to compare it to.
