The Social Justice & Equity Commission supports social justice initiatives as well as historically marginalized communities to uplift them and work to remove institutional barriers through educational campaigns and advocacy. The commission is also responsible for educational campaigns and collaborative events that advance social justice and equity on campus.

These positions are for the 2024-2025 school year. The position term begins once approved by the ASI Board of Directors and ends on May 31, 2025. Some meetings and activities may be required prior to the beginning of the term for transition purposes.

Academic Eligibility:

Any applicant must be in good standing, must not be on probation, must have earned a CSU Fullerton semester grade point average of 2.0 and a CSU Fullerton cumulative grade point average of 2.5 for all classes at CSU Fullerton during the semester prior to their candidacy, and must maintain these standards.

Undergraduate students must earn six (6) semester units of credit per term while holding office. Graduate student must earn three (3) semester units of credit per term while holding office.

Applications must be fully completed and submitted prior to the close of the application. If an application has been started, but not been fully completed and submitted at the time the form is disabled, the form will not notify you or close, but will automatically disable in the background and will not accept your application when you try to submit.

In 2018, the tragic event at Parkland High School deeply affected me and intensified my commitment to raising awareness about gun violence prevention, bullying, and overall safety at my school. This led me to become a board member of March For Our Lives, the student-led organization founded by Parkland students, where I advocated for gun violence prevention in my community for two years. Following this, I interned for two city council members in my city who shared my values, learning about community outreach and securing my first job. I then worked for the Minority Humanitarian Foundation, a nonprofit organization assisting refugees and asylum seekers released from ICE detention facilities.

- 2. Bringing awareness and education on social justice issues to students at CSUF is crucial because it fosters a more inclusive and equitable campus environment. First, I would utilize social media platforms like Instagram, to create engaging content, including event announcements, educational posts, and live updates.
 Collaborating with popular student influencers and organizations on campus could amplify our reach. Additionally, I would design eye-catching flyers and posters to be

displayed around campus in high-traffic areas and distribute informational brochures at student centers and dorms. Hosting informational booths and pop-up events in central locations would provide face-to-face engagement opportunities, allowing us to directly communicate with students about upcoming events. Lastly, I would work closely with faculty and student organizations to integrate our events into their communications, ensuring our message reaches a broad and diverse audience.




