Contact Paper Art

This activity not only is a fun art activity, but also supports cause and effect and fine motor development.

Contact Paper Art

Materials Needed:

Tape (painters tape or washi tape works well)
Contact paper
Tissue Paper cut into squares

Instructions:

1. Remove the backing from the contact paper.
2. With surface safe tape, tape two parts of the flower contact paper to the table with the sticky side up. This will keep the flower from moving.
3. Place tissue paper on the table, being sure to separate the pieces that could be stuck together.
4. Allow your child to put pieces of tissue paper onto the contact paper.
5. When they are done, stick the flower to a window to enjoy like a suncatcher!
