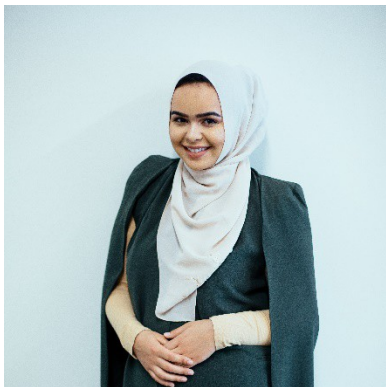

The College of HHD has played a huge part in supporting the 27-member task force assembled to combat this issue, and this is something that can definitely be continued, and even built upon. Another program just recently started is called Tuffy's Basic Needs, and is the first center of its kind in the CSU system to provide food assistance, emergency temporary housing, help with hygiene, access to free professional attire, and financial support to students on campus in need. It is my dream to see a greater student involvement in furthering this initiative, to establish an attitude of Titans helping Titans. Under the umbrella of the College of Health and Human Development there lies a plethora of clubs and organizations that help educate, spread awareness, and take action on many health-related issues. The Substance Abuse Awareness Prevention Student Association, Consent Is Key, the Jumpstart Student Association, and the aforementioned Active Minds Club are only some of the amazing programs students can become involved in. In order to promote a greater amount of student engagement, I would collaborate with the HHD Inter-Club Council, reaching out to Assistant Dean Peggy Bockman as well. For example, one of the most powerful platforms held by a club in HHD is that held by Consent Is Key.
