1. Call to Order

Noah Alvarez, Programs Assessment Committee Chair, called the meeting to order at 2:32 pm

5. Public Speakers

6. Reports

a. Chair

Alvarez, Chair, provided updates on the Program Assessment Committee activities and SRC external review process.

The External Review team is now on campus. Alvarez, along with ASI management, met to discuss strengths and areas for improvement in SRC. Another upcoming meeting with the Internal Review team and Jp Gale, SRC Director, will cover the report and facility needs, with a full update expected at the next Board meeting.

Alvarez expressed gratitude for the team's dedication and collaboration throughout the semester, noting appreciation for their role in advocating for students and preparing items for Board review.

b. Director, Student Government

Hesgard, Director of Student Government, reminded members to complete grading their assigned ASI scholarships by November 17th and to reach out to the Corporate Affairs team if assistance is needed. She thanked participants of the recent Community Chat, which was event with strong engagement from students and campus leaders. Upcoming ASI events include the Pop-Up Pantry on November 20th and 21st. Hesgard also asked anyone interested in attending the Titan Talks event to confirm their attendance by the end of the day.

8. New Business

a. Discussion: Selection of Programs to Assess Spring 2025

The Committee will discuss the selection of programs to assess for the Spring 2025 semester.

Alvarez, Chair, yielded the floor to Hesgard, Director of Student Government, to provide an overview of the programs assessment process.

Hesgard emphasizing the Committee's role in evaluating and selecting ASI programs for assessment. She explained that ASI's assessment efforts are supported by a dedicated Graduate Assistant and area Directors.

Members were reminded of previous presentations from Student Engagement, the Children's Center, Student Recreation Center, and Titan Student Union, each with unique assessment needs and goals.

Hesgard highlighted the SRC's ongoing External Review, advising the Committee to consider other areas for assessment. Key focus areas for selection included the impact of

programs on student wellness, alignment with ASI's Strategic Plan, and specific student interests or challenges with programs.

Hesgard encouraged members to think critically about which programs to prioritize and to develop questions for the assessment process. The Committee's final task in spring will be to present a report with recommendations to the Board, offering insights on program effectiveness, potential improvements, and recommendations for continuation or sunseting.

Sample questions to guide discussions included program impact on student wellness, campus community benefits, alignment with strategic goals, and other unique member interests.

Alvarez, Chair, opened the floor to questions.

Olivares asked about the number of policies they were selecting. Hesgard clarified that ideally, they would select three policies to align with the three meetings scheduled, but there is flexibility for four or five if needed.

Ong inquired about including IT support for website and app development. Hesgard clarified that while IT doesn't typically offer direct programs, there may be a collaboration with Marketing on aspects like website maintenance.

Her asked if program selection would happen in this Committee or via an online form. Hesgard explained that this meeting was primarily for discussion and gathering feedback. The compiled feedback will guide program selection, without the need for a separate feedback form.

Alvarez, Chair, opened the floor to points of discussion.

Ong proposed improving the ASI website and apps, noting navigation issues that make it hard for students to find resources and program information.

Alvarez raised two suggestions: creating an online application process for internships at the Children's Center and examining how student preferences are collected for event artist selections to better reflect student interests.

Her highlighted the need for better visibility and accessibility of E-Sports programs, noting they are often mentioned alongside other recreational activities like bowling but could be more distinct.

Solares suggested simplifying access to the Food Pantry, possibly through an app, to streamline the process for students. Jain recommended integrating the Food Pantry with the iFullerton app, although Alvarez noted that promoting awareness of the app would be necessary to maximize its utility.

Alvarez and Solares both suggested gathering usage data for the E-Sports area to evaluate its marketing effectiveness and potential improvements in visibility.

9. Announcements/Member's Privilege

Ong shared that the College Tour episode featuring CSUF will soon be available on Amazon Prime.

Alvarez reminded everyone about the upcoming scholarship review deadline on the 17th and addressed access issues with his ASI email. He advised visiting PLS 237 for quick assistance with password issues, as he recently did himself.
