b. Director, Student Government

She encouraged Members to set up an introductory meeting with their advisory liason. CAPS has a dedicated staff member for Committee members who may need support. Student Government has a unique relationship with liasons to help connect Committee members when dealing with certain issues such as, persons approaching the board, exterior pressures, and to inform where additional support is needed. Next week the Executive Office will hold a fun event, ASI Wicked Week. There will be an opportunity for students to meet student leaders in their offices. a. Discussion: Review and Selection of Program/ Services for Assessment

Diaz yielded to Nettles to review a presentation on the programs and services to consider for the year. The presentation is an attachment to the minutes.

The Committee reviewed and selected Program(s)/Service(s) for Assessment for the 2021-22 Academic Year.

Diaz opened the floor to questions.

- Mitchell asked, if the committee would be selecting programs for review from the three programs presented or would other programs be considered. Nettles clarified, the focus is to review two of the three. Scholarships, in the presentation, was listed with an asterisk as it will likely receive attention whether the committee selects it or not. There is some need in the scholarships area and it will require the attention of the entire board.
- Mitchell commented, as ASI scholarships will be reviewed, whether selected or not, the other two programs can be selected for review knowing there will be an opportunity to see all three at some point throughout the year.
- Diaz commented, of the services already provided, scholarships will be given attention, attention can be focused toward the Bowling & Billiards and Titan Recreation.
- Mitchell commented, in addition this will ensure no specific area is neglected this year.
- Nettles commented, one program not listed in the presentation was the Children's Center. The Children's Center hiring process is not yet complete. At a future meeting a preview of plans for the Children's Center will be shared, as well as a timeline for other programs and services, but there will be a more comprehensive plan including the two or three programs selected by this committee.
- Diaz asked, are there three or four programs listed for assessment?
 Nettles clarified, the Children's Center was not listed as an option for assessment because the plans are still a work-in-progress.
- Diaz commented, as ASI scholardships will be addressed, focus can be given to the two other programs.

- Diaz announced, a birthday reminder.

Nettles announced, the scholarship submission deadline is 4:00pm on Friday, 10/15/2021. Encouraged committee to remind students to complete and submit their scholarship applications. Once the scholarships are submitted and packaged, the committee can begin review and grading for acceptance of scholarships. There are usually one or two scholarships per pairing or grouping depending on the number of applications.
