#### **BACKGROUND**

The Titan Student Centers Board of Trustees annually reviews and approves the operating hours of the Titan Student Centers.

#### **PROPOSAL**

Approve the operating hours for the Titan Student Centers for the 2021-2022 fiscal year.

#### **RATIONALE**

This proposal is not changing the currently planned operating hours of the Titan Student Centers. In light of the current pandemic and resulting primarily virtual operation, we are using our most recently analyzed and approved hours of operation for the planned 2021-2022 fiscal year. The dates have been adjusted to reflect the CSUF academic and annual calendar that includes events and holidays for the campus.

#### **IMPACT**

This will establish the operating hours for the Titan Student Centers for the 2021-2022 fiscal year.

#### **BUDGET IMPACT**

The approved operating hours are used to develop staffing models necessary to adequately operate the facility programs of the Titan Student Centers. Based on those staffing models, appropriate budget requests are developed and included in the proposed fiscal year budget. The hours of operation directly impact the financial resources necessary to operate the Titan Student Centers.
