## **Contact Paper Art**

This activity not only is a fun art activity, but also supports cause and effect and fine motor development.

## Contact Paper Art

Materials Needed:

Tape (painters tape or washi tape works well) Contact paper Tissue Paper cut into squares

Instructions:

- 1. Remove the backing from the contact paper.
- With surface safe tape, tape two parts of the flower contact paper to the table with the sticky side up. This will keep the flower from moving.
- Place tissue paper on the table, being sure to separate the pieces that could be stuck together.
- 4. Allow your child to put pieces of tissue paper onto the contact paper.
- When they are done, stick the flower to a window to enjoy like a suncatcher!
