5. Reports

a. Chair ~ Fox

Fox informed the Committee of the importance of today's meeting and shared what they will be going over during today's meeting

b. ASI Executive Director ~ Dr. Edwards

Dr. Edwards shared that he and Fox presented an overview of IRA and the current status at the Student Fee Advisory Committee Meeting yesterday. Dr. Ewards commended Fox for his presentation.

7. Unfinished Business

a. Action: 2023-24 IRA Budget Recommendation (Fox)

IRA006 22/23 (Tucker-m/Soto-s) The Committee will consider approving the 2023-24 recommended budget for Instructionally Related Activities.

Fox yielded the floor to Edwards to continue the review of IRA programs.

Dr. Edwards presented the list of programs that are still needing a review and asked if any members would like to review the programs.

Nobari requested a review of 3580, Embedded Processor Interfacing, and 3266, Titan Universe, to determine if they should be funded.

Tucker said he would like to review the ARTs programs that moved from the first to fourth quartile; 3502, Symphonic Orchestra; 3514, Grand Central Theatre and 3506, Musical Theatre.

Fox would like to review 3220, Accounting Theory and Research Symposium.

Dr. Edwards presented program #3502, Symphonic Orchestra, which had a quartile change of two spaces or more.

Dr. Edwards asked if anyone who reviewed the program would like to discuss why they rated the program as they did.

Perez asked whether board members who did not review the application in question could provide input. Dr. Edwards ideally would like the input from the reviewers who were able to read the application, but all board members are open to discuss the programs in question.

Romo shared an overview of her review and rating of the program.

Dr. Edwards shared there is no change to the funding level for this program even though they dropped in quartile ranking.

Tucker asked if they would lose funding if they decide not to fund all the programs. Dr. Edwards addressed Tucker's concern.

Dr. Edwards suggests keeping the six programs brought up into question as a note to figure out how to fund these programs through different budget models.

Dr. Edwards reviewed the revised budget recommendation with partial travel increases. Column T contains the full travel adjustment, which requires using reserve funding. Dr. Edwards shared discussion with Vice President, and they are not opposed to the idea, however, this is not a sustainable idea. Column U gives travel adjustment up to requested amount, and keeps budget in balance. Column Z has a 16% cut with full travel. Column AD has a 50% half travel model. Column AE has a travel adjustment for existing programs but not new programs.

Fox said he is in favor of using the funding from Column U that funds programs with additional travel up to their requested amount.

Fink shared that he would like to fund the programs up to their full request not to exceed the requested total in addition to usage of reserves.

Nobari shared that if they fund fully for Column U she does not know if the programs will use the entire amount they receive for their travel. She does not know if this would be effective. Dr. Edwards suggests to state it as a stipulation that the additional funding received will only be for travel.

Fox shared that the option of Column U is the more equitable option for programs and does not require them to cut programs based on their quartiles.

Macy shared that the option of Column U would reduce the permanent skewing, in comparison to the other models of how programs would be funded in the future.

Nobari asked why 3220, Accounting Theory and Research received a zero-dollar award in the model. Collins shared the based on the funding model and historical use of funds, the program would receive less than the minimum of \$2,000, and they ranked in the fourth quartile.

Dr. Edwards reviewed program #3514, Grand Central Theater, which had a quartile change of two spaces or more.

Tucker said that based on the current conversation he has no concerns regarding the potential funding of these programs if they use the funding recommended in Column U.

Nobari asked that they review the two programs that scored less than a rubric score of 2, 3580, Embedded Processor Interfacing, and 3266, Titan Universe.

Soto reviewed 3580 and felt the narrative of the activity and program goal were unclear. He did not rate this program highly. Nobari asked if Soto felt that this should be funded at the full amount. Soto said he does not see how this program is essential and cannot say yes for that reason. Soto does feel that the program easing the burden of students needing to purchase items is good.

Tucker reviewed concerns with program 3266, Titan Universe. He felt the descriptions were vague and did not share information on the broader impact. He said it did not hold up well against other programs he reviewed. Additionally, Dr. Edwards commented that a website creation may have to run through the university and it wouldn't make sense to have a 3rd party provider.

Fox asked how much the program was requesting. Edwards shared the cost. Fox said he knows that the amount requested is much more than what would be needed for programs.

Macy shared that the work being done in this activity can be completed by students at other locations outside of campus.

Dr. Edwards asked if anyone would like to make changes to the programs that they have reviewed. The Committee had no additional questions or changes.

Dr. Edwards shared that if no one wants to make changes they will use the funding option in Column U.

Dr. Edwards reminded the Committee that an amendment to allocate the use of 100% of the unspent funds from 2021-22 in the amount of \$895,838 would be used for the 2023-24 budget.

Fox asked if there were any objections to move to a roll call vote to approve the 2023-24 IRA budget. There were no objections.

Yes. We have reduced the number guest musicians we plan to hire for our concerts staring with this fall and continuing in Spring 2023. We have also cut the Guest Concert Master for this year. We plan on only having 1 guest artist masterclass in Spring 23' with a reduced rate. We will also cut the instrument equipment rentals, music rental/licensing fees by using public domain music instead. The students will pay for the off-campus meals for our run our concerts. These savings from 8074 will be sufficient to make this line-item transfer to travel so we can offer this once-in-a-lifetime experience performing in Carnegie Hall in June 2023 to the orchestra students.

Since this trip was unplanned and funds are being moved out of 8074 to cover it, what in you proposal do you expect to be offset, let go of, or reduced as a result of moving funding from 8074. Your proposal states your funds in 8074 will be used for the following purposes:

- 20-30 contracted professional musicians @ \$600 \$1,200 playing alongside the student players as mentors and performance collaborators [\$3000]; Talich quartet residency, lessons, masterclasses, rehearsals and performances with students \$20,000; Guest Concertmaster residency, masterclasses, lectures, rehearsals, and performances with students \$6,000; 2-5 guest artist masterclasses with students \$2,500 @ \$12,500 total.
- Quick meals for orchestra members Off-campus rehearsals and performances 60 persons @ \$8 = \$480 x 5 meals = \$2,400 total
- License, copyright, publishers fees for performance rights and materials 15-20 pieces ranging from \$500-\$1,200 @
- Instrument equipment rentals \$3,900
