### 5. Public Speakers

Members of the public may address Board of Directors members on any item appearing on this posted agenda or matters impacting students.

- \* Before opening the floor to comment, Dr. Edwards formally introduced ASI's new CFO, Kathleen Postal. Postal was invited to the podium to speak to the Board.
- \*Austin Ysais, Assistant Director of Student Programs and Engagement thanked members of the Board that attended Beyond the Conversation and the programming team for their hard work supporting the event.
- \* Ysais invited the Board to the tailgate event in support of the Women's Soccer team competing against UC Irvine.

#### 6. Time Certain

a. 1:30 pm: Anthony Frisbee, CSUF University Police Chief Zazueta, Chair, introduced Anthony Frisbee, CSUF Chief of Police.

Frisbee, on behalf of the CSUF Police Department, reviewed a presentation on the department and collaborative measures implemented to support safety on campus.

Data on 2023 Operation Trends were shared with the Board; Developing protocols to share data to the public to be transparent.

A mission of the department is to partner with students, staff, and faculty to support a safe, inclusive, and welcoming university for students.

Frisbee discussed the Operational Paradigm Shift which is a newholistic approach tosafety response on campus; Part of this safety system includes the CAPS Crisis Mobile Response Team.

The department offers Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion trainings such as the CSUF Inclusive Champion Certificate Program, the Inclusive Leadership Symposium, and the Activating Leadership with Values training.

Frisbee shared with the Board that he is open to community feedback and seeks more through engagement programs like the Community Police Academy and the Pink Patch event held in partnership with the Titan Bookstore.

Zazueta opened the floor to questions and points of discussion.

\* Macedonio asked if the data shared to the Board will be published online for the public.

- \* Frisbee replied that the data will be published to the department's website until October and updated onwards either the 15th or 20th of each month.
- \* Furtado asked how students are protected from theft as there was an incident involving a van theft earlier in the week.
- \* Frisbee responded that the department continues to do its patrol checks and is working closely with parking enforcement in the matter.
- \* Ong asked if there is a more immediate change regarding the alert sent out as there is no updated information from the department's Twitter account.
- \* Frisbee stated that there is a need to address updating information on Twitter. However, emails and phone calls are sent for timely warnings.
- \* Ruelas asked if the department has considered using bicycles instead of vehicles to patrol on campus as it may be more comfortable for students.
- \* Frisbee replied that student workers do utilize bikes, however, officers use vehicles to move faster around campus in case of emergency.
- \* Morales, S. asked how often the Community Academy is hosted.
- \* Frisbee replied that the Academy is for six weeks and is one night a week for a couple hours.
- \* Ramirez-Rivera asked if it is possible for patrol cars to not be parked close to safe spaces like DIRC as it is triggering for some students.
- \* Frisbee stated that the department needs to be intentional as to where they are parking and appreciates the feedback.
- b. 2:00 pm: Dr. Arnold Holland, Dean of College of Arts Zazueta, chair, introduced Dr. Arnold Holland, Dean of College of Arts.

Dr. Holland reviewed a presentation for the College of the Arts. He provided an overview of the various departments and programs within the college, including: Art, Music, and Theatre and Dance. CSUF's College of Arts is the largest in the CSU system.

Holland presented to the Board the College of Arts' campus and community engagement which involves theatre and dance shows, and visual arts exhibitions complimentary to CSUF students.

Holland pointed out department highlights such as the jazz ensemble touring in New Zealand and theatre program's participation in the Edinburg Theatre Festival.

Holland mentioned the construction of the visual arts complex which is designed to include most art departments.

Holland announced the Titan Transfer Event and First-Generation Alumni Panel to inform students about the campus' resources and network.

Zazueta, Chair, opened the floor to questions and points of discussion.

- \* Furtado asked how the college is handling the GE requirements with the new influx of students as many students already have trouble with this requirement.
- \* Holland responded that he hopes the AB 928 bill passes as this would streamline GE requirement issues.
- \* Nguyen asked what technologies are being incorporated in the College of the Arts.
- \* Holland replied that the college is building computer labs, green screen rooms, and spaces that allow for changes when necessary to remain forward thinking.
- \* Ong asked if there is a supplementary support of proceeds for arts programs since tickets are now free for students.
- \* Holland replied that there is support through partnership with the Provost's Office.
- \* Nguyen asked how the graduate spaces for the Visual Arts are being filled.
- \* Holland replied that he is working with the Graduate Studies Office to figure out how to attract more students to CSUF's programs.
- c. 2:15 pm: Jim Donovan, Director of CSUF Athletics
  Zazueta, chair, introduced Jim Donovan, Director of CSUF Athletics.

Donovan thanked the Board's predecessors for their support in the Student Success Initiative.

Donovan announced the successes of track and field, soccer, water polo, and cross country.

Donovan introduced Taylor Mason, a water polo athlete, to speak to the Board.

Mason spoke of her personal experience as a transfer-athlete student and her current experiences with her classes at CSUF.

Mason thanked the Board for bringing water polo to campus and invited the Board to water polo games.

Donovan thanked the Board for the tailgates done last year and proceeded to introduce Tony Chavez, a cross country athlete.

Chavez thanked the Board for helping fund student-athletes as he has noticed how this has positively changed the performance of the team.

Chavez invited the Board to a home cross country meet on October 20th.

Zazueta opened the floor to questions and points of discussion.

- \* Ruelas made a point of discussion emphasizing that Titan Pride is important and looks forward to seeing what more the Board can do.
- \* Macedonio thanked the student-athletes for speaking to the Board.
- \* Ong asked if there is anything more the Board can do to support athletics.
- \* Donovan replied that he appreciates the tailgates and would like a continuation of Titan Pride in the strategic plan.







(ASI) to better serve the mission and charge as directed by the ASI Board of Directors. The policy includes the guidelines, eligibility, disbursement, and establishment of scholarships provided by ASI.

#### STANDARDS/REGULATIONS/PROCEDURES

#### 1. SCHOLARSHIP GUIDELINES

#### a. Application

The regular scholarship application shall open on the first weekday of the academic semester and will remain open for at least 7 weeks.

#### b. Repeated Applicants

ASI scholarship recipients cannot be awarded the same scholarship in consecutive years, but may apply for other ASI scholarships. Recipients are eligible to win a previously awarded scholarship two years following the initial award of that scholarship.

#### c. Eligibility Check

In collaboration with Student Government, applications will be reviewed for eligibility in the following areas:

- a. Good standing
- b. Current semester GPA
- C. Current cumulative GPA
- d. Units currently enrolled

#### d. Scholarship Grading

Scholarships shall be reviewed and graded by the review committee including student leaders, ambassadors, ASI staff and campus faculty volunteers. The committee will use a rubric to determine the overall applicant rating.

#### e. Disbursement

ASI will disburse the scholarship funds directly to the student awardee in the semester of their award.

#### f. Office of Financial Aid

ASI notifies the CSUF Office of Financial Aid of all scholarship awards.

#### 2. SCHOLARSHIP CRITERIA

Scholarship awards shall be reviewed, modified, and funds reallocated at the direction of the ASI Board of Directors.

a. Adult Re-Entry Scholarship. This scholarship was established by Associated Students to
acknowledge and support the adult reentry students of CSUF. This scholarship recognizes an
adult re-entry student with outstanding campus and/or community involvement and is funded by
Associated Students,

Amount: \$1.000

Criteria: Applicants must have a cumulative GPA of 2.8, be enrolled in a minimum of 6 units, and be able to demonstrate community and/or campus involvement and scholastic and/or personal achievement.

b. Carol Burke Memorial Scholarship. This scholarship was established in the spring of 2000 in

the memory of Carol Burke. Mrs. Burke was a member of the ASI/TSU staff for 8 years. She served as a Night Manager, Assistant Director of Operations, and finally Director of the Titan Student Union. She enjoyed working with student leaders and was dedicated to student development. Mrs. burke was a three-time, All-American basketball players at California State Polytechnic University, Pomona in 1981-1983 and was inducted into the Cal Poly Pomona Hall of Fame in 1990. This scholarship is only offered in the Spring semester.

Amount: \$1,000

Criteria: Applicants must have a cumulative GPA of 2.8 and demonstrate participation in a recognized on-campus sports club, Intramural, or National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) team. Undergraduate and credential students must be enrolled in a minimum of 12 units. Graduate students must be enrolled in a minimum of 6 units.

c. Graduate Student Scholarship. This scholarship was established by Associated Students to acknowledge and support the graduate students of CSUF. This scholarship recognizes graduate or credential program students with outstanding campus and/or community involvement and is funded by the Associated Students

Amount: \$1,000

Criteria: Applicants must have a cumulative GPA of 3.0, be enrolled in a minimum of 6 units and demonstrate (1) community and/or campus involvement, (2) scholastic and/or personal achievement and (3) prospective postgraduate goals.

d. **Formerly Incarcerated Students Scholarship**. This scholarship was established by Associated Students to support formerly incarcerated students who have attended California State University, Fullerton for a minimum of one semester. This scholarship allocation includes 5 scholarships in the Fall semester and 5 scholarships in the Spring semester.

Amount: \$1,000

Criteria: Applicants must have a cumulative CSUF GPA or 2.5, be formerly incarcerated and be enrolled in a minimum of 6 units.

e. Harvey McKee Student Leadership Scholarship The Harvey A. McKee Distinguished Student Leadership Scholarship was established in 2004 to recognize Mr. McKee for his contributions to Associates Students, Inc. and the CSUF campus community. In his 34 years at CSU Fullerton, Harvey has become a friend, mentor, and colleague with many student leaders through his associations with the Titan Student Union, and the Associated Students, Inc. Campus faculty, administrators and staff know Harvey for his friendliness, his advocacy of student issues, and his willingness to be a proactive professional on behalf of the campus community.

Amount: \$1,000

Criteria: Applicants must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 and demonstrate leadership experience in a CSUF club or organization. Undergraduates and credential students must be enrolled in a minimum of 12 units. Graduate students must be enrolled in a minimum of 6 units.

f. **Kyle O'Brien Memorial Scholarship**. This scholarship was established by Associated Students to honor the memory of Kyle S. O'Brien, an outstanding ASI student leader and CSUF athlete. This scholarship recognizes a student with outstanding campus and/or community involvement, as well as participation in an organized sport on campus. The scholarship was originally funded by the Kyle S. O'Brien Memorial Scholarship Fund but is now funded by Associated Students. This scholarship is only offered in the Fall semester.

Amount: \$1,000

Criteria: Applicants must have a minimum cumulative CSUF GPA of 3.0 and demonstrate (1) scholastic and/or personal achievement, (2) community and/or campus involvement and (3) participation in a recognized on-campus sports club, intramurals or National Collegiate Athletic

Association (NCAA) team. Undergraduates and credential program students must be enrolled in a minimum of 12 units. Graduate students must be enrolled in a minimum of 6 units.

g. **William G. Pollock Scholarship**. This scholarship was established in the fall of 1997 to honor and acknowledge Mr. Pollock for his long-standing and tremendous contributions to CSUF and involvement with the Associated Students during his 30 years of service. The majority of his contributions were made in his position as Associated Students Administrator. His dedication, experience and knowledge were essential components in the success of Associated Students. This scholarship is only offered in the Fall semester.

Amount: \$1,000

Criteria: Applicants must have a minimum CSUF GPA of 2.5 and demonstrate (1) community and/or campus involvement and (2) scholastic and/or personal achievement. This scholarship is open to continuing CSUF full-time undergraduate, graduate and credential program students. First semester students are not eligible. Undergraduates and credential students must be enrolled in a minimum of 12 units; Graduate students must be enrolled in a minimum of 6 units.

h. **William D. Puzo Memorial Scholarship**. This scholarship was established by Associated Students to honor the memory of William D. Puzo, a dedicated CSUF professor, for his contributions to ASI and the students of CSUF. This scholarship recognizes a student with outstanding campus and/or community involvement, and is funded by the Associated Students, CSUF, Inc. Scholarship Fund, which is supported by donations from the Titan Shops Book Requisition Program. This scholarship is only offered in the Fall semester.

Amount: \$1,000

Criteria: Applicants must have a minimum CSUF GPA of 3.0 and demonstrate (1) community and/or campus involvement and (2) scholastic and/or personal achievement. Undergraduates and credential students must be enrolled in a minimum of 12 units. Graduate students must be enrolled in a minimum of 6 units.

**Milton A. Gordon Memorial Scholarship.** This scholarship was established in the fall of 2023 in honor of Dr. Milton Gordon, the fourth president of California State University, Fullerton (1990-2012). During his 22 year term as president, Dr. Gordon demonstrated a passion for equitable access to higher education, and he served as an inspirational, compassionate and generous leader. Dr. Gordon's theme during his educational career was to support all students, particularly those who would otherwise have little or no chance at achieving a college degree. This scholarship is only offered in the Spring.

Amount: \$1,000

Criteria: Applicants must have a minimum CSUF cumulative GPA of 2.5 and demonstrate campus and/or community leadership experience. Undergraduate and credential students to be enrolled in a minimum of 12 units. Graduate students must be enrolled in a minimum of 6 units.

i. **Student-Parent Scholarship**. This scholarship is open to continuing CSUF full-time undergraduate, graduate, and credential students who are parents of one or more dependent children.

Amount: \$1,000

Criteria: Applicants must have a minimum CSUF cumulative GPA of 2.5, enrolled in a minimum of 8 units, be a student parent and demonstrate (1) community and/or campus involvement and (2) scholastic and/or personal achievement.

j. Undocumented Students Scholarship. This scholarship was established by Associated Students for any currently enrolled continuing undocumented or AB 540 students who have attended California State University, Fullerton for a minimum of one semester. The allocation for this scholarship is 10 scholarship awards in the Fall semester and 10 in the Spring semester.

## ASSOCIATED STUDENTS INC., CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY, FULLERTON

Amount: \$1,000

Criteria: Applicants must have a CSUF cumulative GPA of 2.5, be an undocumented or AB 540 student, enrolled in a minimum of 6 units, and demonstrate community and/or campus involvement (extracurricular activities and achievements will be considered).

k. Virginia McGarvey Memorial Scholarship. This scholarship was originally funded by an ASI Board allocation, student fees, individual donations, and Titan Shops. Established in 1994 to honor Mrs. Virginia McGarvey. Mrs. McGarvey was a prominent resident of Fullerton and a long-time supporter of Cal State Fullerton, Associated Students, and the student body. She was a humanitarian and well known for having devoted a large portion of her life to helping others. This scholarship is only offered in the Spring semester.

Amount: \$1,000

Criteria: Applicants must have a CSUF cumulative GPA of 2.8 and demonstrate (1) community and/or campus involvement and (2) scholastic and/or personal achievement. Undergraduate and credential students must be enrolled in a minimum of 12 units. Graduate students must be enrolled in a minimum of 8 units.

 International Student Scholarship. This scholarship was established by Board resolution in Spring 2021 to support the academic success and wellbeing of international students at Cal State Fullerton. The breakdown for this scholarship is 8 scholarships in the Fall semester and 7 scholarships in the Spring semester.

Amount: \$1,000

Criteria: Applicant must have a CSUF cumulative GPA of 2.5 and be an international student. Undergraduate and credential students must be enrolled in a minimum of 12 units. Graduate students must be enrolled in a minimum of 6 units

#### 3. ADDITIONAL FINANCIAL SUPPORT TO STUDENTS

a. ASI & Titan Shops Book Voucher This program was established by Associated Students and Titan Shops in the fall 1995, with the cooperation and financial support of Titan Shops, to further support students in their quest for higher education. The book scholarship program is a unique program that provides 45 students with books and course materials for the entire semester at no cost to them. This program recognizes students with outstanding campus and/or community involvement, and is administered by Associated Students and funded by Titan Shops. This scholarship is available in the fall and spring semesters.

Amount: \$250

Criteria: Applicants must have a cumulative CSUF GPA of 2.5 and demonstrate (1) community and/or campus involvement and (2) scholastic and/or personal achievement. Undergraduate and credential students must be enrolled in a minimum of 12 units. Graduate students must be enrolled in a minimum of 6 units.

#### 4. CONSIDERATIONS FOR NEW SCHOLARSHIPS

a. In-Memoriam Scholarships.

Scholarships created in honor or recognition of an individual, entity, or organization must be funded from an external source for a minimum of 3 years and be \$1,000 per award. ASI maintains the right to continue or discontinue the scholarship after the initial funding has been expended.

## ASSOCIATED STUDENTS INC., CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY, FULLERTON

All scholarships created in-memoriam are to be reviewed and processed with the regular scholarship application process. Requests for involvement and review of the submitted applications and identification of the student awardee by external parties will not be considered. ASI maintains the right to adjust the academic requirements to best meet the needs of the students applying to the scholarship as well as to comply with state or university requirements.

b. Affinity Group (specific population) Scholarships

Eligibility Scholarships may be established to support specific populations at Cal State Fullerton. Eligibility criteria will reflect the standards established by the Board of Directors for general scholarship awards, including, current student status, GPA, and number of enrolled units.

All affinity group scholarships shall be reviewed and processed in conjunction with the regular application and award process. Requests for involvement and review of the submitted applications and identification of the student awardee by external parties will not be considered. ASI maintains the right to adjust the academic requirements to best meet the needs of the students applying to the scholarship as well as to comply with state or university requirements.

#### 1. In your own words, describe the purpose of the Elections Team.

It is extremely important to have students know about voting, what a vote means, and how their choice of candidates will impact CSUF Students. We saw it almost a year ago, the Wellness Initiative was pushed and shown to students by our Student Government. This is only achievable by participation and willingness to participate in the process.

#### 3. How you would direct, support, manage, and oversee the Elections team and program?

- I would describe myself as a team first Leader. I like to assign things to my committee that I know they can achieve and become great at. I would make sure that they are receiving all the support they need and I will be available to help or provide guidance to whatever questions they have or need. Overseeing the Elections program would follow a similar process, I will be available to any candidate if they have any questions and if they file a Report, I will make sure they receive equitable treatment and work with the Director, and my committee on solving issues.

#### 4. Describe the ideas or goals you have for next year for the position.

- Last semester we saw a low voter turnout, and in my opinion it was because of low candidate turnout. Students want to hear two opinions and want the power to make a decision. One of my goals for the next year is to have three different candidates running for ASI President/Vice President. I also want to hold more events in which the role is advertised so students know the benefits of voting as well as holding this position.

#### 5. Describe how you would promote the activities and events of the Elections Team.

- Titan's social media is great and it gets people out and at the event. Another way to promote activities and events of the Elections Team is to show the purpose of coming out to a student who is a commuter. We can do this by stopping students on TitanWalk, weekly tabling. The more brand recognition we start now in the Fall, students in the Spring will recognize what the Elections is all about and we can promote our activities and events with a head start in the Spring, rather than playing catch-up.
