Ong yielded the floor to Kathleen Postal to review the resolution. Highlights of Presentation:

- \* Postal discussed the current retirement plan and the payment of medical insurance up until Medicare is activated.
- \* Trust fund is used to pay for future retirees' medical insurance.
- \* ASI President and Treasurer are appointed to serve as co-trustees/members of the trust.

Ong opened the floor to questions. There were no questions. Ong opened the floor to discussion.

Jarvis directed a question to Edwards, inquiring about why the document states that a student "resigns" when, in fact, their term simply concludes. Jarvis commented there is an implied difference that should be addressed.

Edwards replied that it is due to the nature of being replaced, however, he does consider a change of wording.

Ong asked if there were any objections to approving the resolution to approve the Post-Retirement Health Care and Life Insurance Benefits Plan Co-Trustees 2024-2025 and to add Samantha Ngo, ASI Board Treasurer's name to the resolution. There were no objections.

BOD 007 24/25 (Solares-m/Jain-s) Roll Call Vote: 14-0-0 The motion to approve the 2024-25 Resolution Concerning Post-Retirement Health Care and Life Insurance Employee Benefit Plan Co-Trustees was adopted.

Ong yielded the floor to Kathleen Postal to review the resolution.

Postal gave an overview of the trust with City National Bank. Presentation Highlights:

- \* City National Bank is where most of the reserves are for the Children's Center and facility improvements, and trust investments.
- \* Resolution allows ASI to have designated signers to use the funds and invest the funds therefore adjustment for every year is necessary

Ong yielded the floor to Morales, J. to speak on the selection process for the position.

Morales, J. discussed his thorough review of candidates for the position and concluded that Andrea Ramirez-Rivera is an ideal candidate, citing her leadership on various projects as a significant factor in his decision.

Ong opened the floor to questions. There were none. Ong opened the floor to discussion.

Morales, J. expressed her support for Ramirez Rivera, noting her passion and extensive experience as strong qualifications for her candidacy.

Walkley also expressed his support for Andrea Ramirez-Rivera, citing her advocacy for undocumented students and her commitment to a ceasefire resolution.

Rubio commented on Ramirez-Rivera's qualifications, endorsing her candidacy for the position with confidence.

Ong asked if there were any objections to moving to a roll call vote. There were no objections.

Brown highlighted Syed's DIRC experience, talent, and hard work, emphasizing that these qualities make her a highly qualified candidate. He recommended that members vote for her.

Morales, J. conveyed information from the candidate, highlighting some of her goals, which include arranging meet and greets with university officials, collaborating with departments, launching environmental campaigns, and advocating for sustainable transportation on campus.

#### California Education Code Section 89906

No member of the governing board of an auxiliary organization shall be financially interested in any contract or other transaction entered into by the board of which he is a member, and any contract or transaction entered into in violation of this section is void.

#### California Education Code Section 89907

No contract or other transaction entered into by the governing board of an auxiliary organization is void under the provisions of Section 89906, nor shall any member of such board be disqualified or deemed guilty of misconduct in office under said provisions, if the circumstances specified in the following subdivisions exist:

- (a) The fact of such financial interest is disclosed or known to the governing board and noted in the minutes, and the governing board thereafter authorizes, approves, or ratifies the contract or transaction in good faith by a vote sufficient for the purpose without counting the vote or votes of such financially interested member or members, and
- (b) The contract or transaction is just and reasonable as to the auxiliary organization at the time it is authorized or approved.

#### California Education Code Section 89908

The provisions of Section 89907 shall not be applicable if the circumstances specified in any of the following subdivisions exist:

- (a) The contract or transaction is between an auxiliary organization and a member of the governing board of that auxiliary organization.
- (b) The contract or transaction is between an auxiliary organization and a partnership or unincorporated association of which any member of the governing board of that auxiliary organization is a partner or in which he is the owner or holder, directly or indirectly, of a proprietorship interest.
- (c) The contract or transaction is between an auxiliary organization and a corporation in which any member of the governing board of that auxiliary organization is the owner or holder, directly or indirectly, of 5 percent or more of the outstanding common stock.
- (d) A member of the governing board of an auxiliary organization is interested in a contract or transaction within the meaning of Section 89906, and without first disclosing such interest to the governing board at a public meeting of the board, influences or attempts to influence another member or members of the board to enter into the contract or transaction.

#### California Education Code Section 89909

It is unlawful for any person to utilize any information, not a matter of public record, which is received by him by reason of his membership on the governing board of an auxiliary organization, for personal pecuniary gain, regardless of whether he is or is not a member of the governing board at the time such gain is realized.

Any duties and liabilities set forth in this article shall apply without regard to whether a director is compensated by the corporation.

#### California Corporations Code Section 5231

- (a) A director shall perform the duties of a director, including duties as a member of any committee of the board upon which the director may serve, in good faith, in a manner that director believes to be in the best interests of the corporation and with such care, including reasonable inquiry, as an ordinarily prudent person in a like position would use under similar circumstances.
- (b) In performing the duties of a director, a director shall be entitled to rely on information, opinions, reports or statements, including financial statements and other financial data, in each case prepared or presented by:
- (1) One or more officers or employees of the corporation whom the director believes to be reliable and competent in the matters presented;
- (2) Counsel, independent accountants or other persons as to matters which the director believes to be within that person's professional or expert competence; for
- (3) A committee upon which the director does not serve that is composed exclusively of any or any combination of directors, persons described in paragraph (1), or persons described in paragraph (2), as to matters within the committee's designated authority, which committee the director believes to merit confidence, so long as, in any case, the director acts in good faith, after reasonable inquiry when the need therefor is indicated by the circumstances and without knowledge that would cause that reliance to be unwarranted.

#### California Corporations Code Section 5233

- (a) Except as provided in subdivision (b), for the purpose of this section, a self-dealing transaction means a transaction to which the corporation is a party and in which one or more of its directors has a material financial interest and which does not meet the requirements of paragraph (1), (2), or (3) of subdivision (d). Such a director is an "interested director" for the purpose of this section.
- (b) The provisions of this section do not apply to any of the following:
- (1) An action of the board fixing the compensation of a director as a director or officer of the corporation.
- (2) A transaction which is part of a public or charitable program of the corporation if it: (i) is approved or authorized by the corporation in good faith and without unjustified favoritism; and (ii) results in a benefit to one or more directors or their families because they are in the class of persons intended to be benefited by the public or charitable program.
- (3) A transaction, of which the interested director or directors have no actual knowledge, and which does not exceed the lesser of 1 percent of the gross receipts of the corporation for the preceding fiscal year or one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000).

#### 1. How would you describe the purpose and role of the Lobby Corps Commission?

The purpose of the Lobby Corps commission is to advocate for student needs in higher education. The team is responsible for assessing what the student body needs and why these needs need to be addressed by officials and then advocate for them on behalf of the students. The purpose of the commission is also to promote civic engagement through opportunities where students can be informed about public policy on the national, state and local level. The commission is also in charge of starting initiatives and campaigns for the student body through policies that promote the betterment of the Titan experience.

# 2. How do you plan to motivate, mobilize, and utilize the Lobby Corps Team and Commission to advocate for improved public higher education policy and funding? Please be descriptive and specific.

The way that I plan to utilize the Lobby Corps team to advocate for better higher education policy and funding is to ensure my team is strategic when asking for student needs. My strategy would be to first take present and past assessments on the demographics of the university to see who is being severely underrepresented or underfunded. Second, with my team's research and newfound statistics I want to present my findings to our current campus officials almost in the form of a legal case, of why we need to assess needs and ask for more funding from the CSU system or local legislatures. An example of this would be to help educational programs that are severely underfunded. I want to highlight student voices and be a bridge between what our campus has done thus far and what we can do even more. I plan to motivate and mobilize the lobby corps commision to engage with the student body by having them go to a variety of student-led and campus events. It is important for the commission to be visible to students alongside myself if I were to get the position. I want Lobby Corps to be not intimidating for students to approach but rather inform us about the issues and policies we need to address. I would love for lobby corps to be actively involved in everything mentioned above and take initiative on building a campus that is politically conscious and civically engaged.

## 5. What goals and ideas do you have for the position and its areas of responsibility, and how would you improve upon what the position is doing now or has done in the past?

I would love to build upon the series which ASI has done in the past about policies but make them more consistent and interactive. I would love for students who are passionate in politics to come to these events or those who may not know about what is happening to be well informed on what they can do. I would also like to highlight current events that may be happening in the world and share what students can do based upon these situations. It is important to note that I understand how polarized the current political climate is in the world and on campus. My goal for this position is to have students ensure they can inform their opinions based on accurate knowledge and no bias. Civic engagement may look very different in practice but my hope is that through Lobby Corps and the initiatives I can potentially start, the word "politics" becomes less frightening to students. Through the position I would also love to bring guest speakers on campus for networking opportunities for students that can help with their personal and professional development. 

New graduate students who received a bachelor's degree or credential within the past three (3) years from CSUF must have earned a total of twelve (12) units during his or her last year as an undergraduate to be eligible. Graduate student candidates for office must have earned at least six (6) semester units per term of continuous attendance as a new graduate student to be eligible.
- -All student candidates for, or current student officers serving in, an elected or appointed position within ASI must be in good standing, must not be on probation, must have earned a CSU Fullerton semester grade point average of 2.0 and a CSU Fullerton cumulative grade point average of 2.5 for all classes at CSU Fullerton during the semester prior to their candidacy, and must maintain these standards.
