This work is based off of destructive thinking and the effects it may come with. The female character is an example of massive amounts of overthinking in an endless cycle of stress and worry that ended up doing more harm than good. All of those destructive thoughts and behavior eventually gets out and it's going to look hideous leaving you completely devoid of any sense of yourself you had leaving behind an empty husk. Initially this work was just the two characters, but due to the nature of the weight distribution among them, it needed support. The female character's head is heavier than her body so I needed something for her to lean on and so long as the female was stable, the demon would be fine. I didn't just want to have some random thing holding up this piece so I created a rock with exposed wires coming out of it with XPS foam for a sort of stand. I put some fishing weights in the foam stand to ensure that it would stay in place and hold up the head's weight.

ARTIST STATEMENT

My Name is Salvador Cabrera and I mainly like to work in my cartoonish style, although I love to add gore and horror elements to my style due to its contrast. Noxious Liberation is the first time I've ever worked with ceramic clay and the 5th sculpture I've ever made. I don't typically work in 3D media, I'm more of a 2D colored pencil type of person, but working in that extra dimension gives off a new sense of life to the characters I create that is honestly kind of addicting. Being able to physically hold these characters and see how they hold when not on paper is genuinely really cool. It's also nice to give my fingers a break from the pains of using colored pencils.



Kathleen Carcoba

The Vacuum Cleaner

I have been captivated by cleaning tools ever since I was a young child. My late mother's meticulous use of these tools left a lasting impression on me, and I found myself carefully observing the way they effortlessly removed dust and dirt. "The Vacuum Cleaner", in particular, became an anthropomorphic character in my mind, symbolizing the concept of renewal.

Life often presents us with opportunities for renewal, much like the back-and-forth motion of a vacuum cleaner as it cleans an area. I see this motion as a metaphor for the ebb and flow of experiences in life, including the ability to learn from our mistakes and continually create and resolve new challenges. This perspective has allowed me to view life as a series of learning experiences, where each back-and-forth movement represents a chance to grow and improve.

ARTIST STATEMENT

I'm interested in the raw form of sculpture. The material that is made from: the conscious mind and subconscious impulse. It is within this space I grapple with the profound questions of life, loss, and resilience.

I aim to produce work that invites contemplation and dialogue. By employing metaphors that relate to everyday objects, I strive to offer a space for both myself and my audience to find connection and understanding. Each sculpture captures a reflection of an emotional landscape from childhood to personal pain. These landscapes then transform into universal themes to connect to my audience embracing the human experience in all its complexities.



Jacob Carter

Blown Lamp

Glass & Copper Wire

This work is a glass piece blown into a copper wire mold to create exaggerated glass forms. The piece was later grinded down and attached to a lamp holder to make it a functional piece of art.

ARTIST STATEMENT

As a jeweler, metal is a solid yet formidable material that has its own endless possibilities. But upon discovering glass this past year, another set of possibilities was created. Glass in its molten form is this "living" material that can be altered and shaped for moments at a time before it needs to heat up again. "Blown Lamp" has allowed me to explore further into the glass medium while also giving me the opportunity to combine metal with glass. This piece allows me to discover new techniques and skills within the material for future potential projects. My goal was to push glass to its boundaries while simultaneously being contained by the copper wire to create these elaborate forms. I then saw the opportunity to turn this glass piece into a functional piece of art, becoming what is now known as "Blown Lamp".



Jessica Cayetano **Sombrero** Mixed Media Category: 3D Art

I photographed businesses I frequently buy from, such as clothes, food, jewelry, religious objects, and piñatas. I collaged them based on the shops and used Mod Podge to glue the images. Then, I hot-glued miniature objects on the rim of the sombrero.

ARTIST STATEMENT

I was born and raised in Anaheim, California. Growing up, my parents always involved me in our Mexican culture and traditions, impacting my art style and subjects. I have created a series of artworks outside the stereotypes of Mexican culture. Doing this has taught me new ways to represent my cultural identity and utilize materials from my culture. My Sombrero depicts various shops from the Anaheim Indoor Marketplace, the largest indoor swap meet, with unique shops and live entertainment. I photographed businesses I frequently buy from, such as clothes, food, jewelry, and religious objects. I collaged the images on my grandpa's sombrero. In addition, I added a few miniature objects on top of the sombrero, such as lotteria cards, miniature food plates, drinks, and another sombrero that says "Viva Mexico" to show the viewers other elements of my culture. As I created this artwork, I wanted people to interact and experience my work by moving around the sombrero, focusing on each detail. They will notice that each shop is unique and full of color and life. This artwork, in particular, can help people understand an aspect of my life and culture that is not seen in the mainstream or stereotypical.

This piece features a crocheted bear who, despite being created without eyes, paints a self-portrait in which the bear has eyes. The inspiration for this artwork stems from the idea of self-perception and imagination. How does one envision themselves, especially when limited by what they cannot see? The bear symbolizes the power of imagination and self-awareness. Though the bear lacks physical eyes, it has the ability to create an image of itself, suggesting that identity is shaped by more than what we can see. It explores the concept of inner vision and how we project our perceptions of ourselves into the world. I invite viewers to reflect on how they perceive themselves versus how others may see them. Do we need to see ourselves clearly to understand who we are, or can we rely on an inner sense of identity that transcends the physical? This artwork asks: How do we define ourselves when the tools we usually rely on-like sight-are absent?

ARTIST STATEMENT

The central theme in my work is the exploration of unseen truths. I'm intrigued by how individuals perceive themselves versus how they are perceived by the world. Much of my art plays with this contrast-between the visible and invisible, the external and internal self. Through my art, I hope to encourage viewers to question the role of perception in their own lives. Can we trust what we see? Or are the truest parts of ourselves hidden, waiting to be discovered through imagination and introspection? In conclusion, I create art to remind people that there is more to life than what meets the eye. My work seeks to open up a space for introspection, where viewers can tap into their own unseen strengths and find beauty in the unknown.

In addition, the figure is drained of all color and life, in contrast to their environment. The ground around them is also rugged and unkept, adding to the purgatorial nature of the environment.

ARTIST STATEMENT

Esteban Marin is a 21-year-old senior at CSU Fullerton, majoring in Creative Photography and Experimental Media. His fine art photography is centered around conceptual, environmental portraiture. Having a theatrical background, his images often are often a large production that is written, financed, directed, and sometimes even acted out by the artist. He is often inspired by grand portraiture paintings, and photographers such as Cindy Sherman and Charlie White. In preparation for a project, he will often start with a mood or emotion, and build visuals in a sketchbook. 

ARTIST STATEMENT




DESCRIPTION






