Developmental Skill Building Areas:

 Classification
 This activity can be used to help young children practice matching, classifying, and measuring. This is an important part of developing early math skills.



Setting up this sticker sorting activity is so easy!

Materials Used:

- Non-stick tape to ensure your paper is easy to remove.
- Colored dot stickers, varying colors works best if you have the same colored construction paper.
- Colored construction paper varying colors that match the dot sticker colors.

Activity Steps:

- 1. Tape colored construction paper to a wall.
- 2. Give your child the stickers and you can either ask them to match the stickers and colored paper.
- 3. You can also extend the learning for children that are interested in sorting by asking them to stick two blue stickers on the blue paper etc.
- 4. Some children may not be interested in placing the stickers on the same paper. Just follow the lead and let your child enjoy the activity however they like.





The power of sorting activities!

Sorting activities can be started with young toddlers – it's one of the first math concepts that children can grasp.

Classifying and sorting activities help children to develop a range of thinking skills and build the foundations for later problem-solving skills.

During this activity, your child will practice:

- Sorting
- Working with fine motor skills
- Practicing color words / vocabulary
