Dear Parent/Guardian,

Please find enclosed a blank application for this year's Camp Titan summer camp program. I hope you will read this information and consider submitting an application for your child/children. Camp Titan is a one-week-long residential (overnight) summer camp program that is completely free to accepted applicants. Our program is the philanthropy/charity of the Associated Students, Incorporated at California State University, Fullerton and is aimed at serving children from the local community and those that might come from low income or underprivileged backgrounds.

This year's camp will happen **Sunday, June 9th through Saturday, June 15th**. Campers must be **at least 7 years old and not older than 14 years old** on the first day of camp (June 9, 2019). The **priority deadline for applications to be considered is Wednesday, March 27th**, but applications may be submitted after this date and will be considered if space is available. Before submitting an application, please check when your child's/children's last day of school is this year. **Sometimes our camp week conflicts with the last week of school for some school districts**, please double check. Camp Titan happens in Big Bear, California at Camp Oakes, a campsite owned and operated by the YMCA of Greater Long Beach, which we rent to host our camp program. At camp, we provide activities like canoeing, swimming, climbing wall, ropes courses, astronomy, arts and crafts, hiking and nature education, archery, and more. Campers stay in cabin dorms that have running water, showers, and flush toilets. Campers are in cabins of ten with two counselors. All of our counselors are student volunteers from Cal State Fullerton and we bring a number of full time professionals, including a currently registered nurse, to oversee any medications and health care for camp. Through our program, we hope that campers will learn the things described in our Camp Titan Learning Outcomes listed on the reverse of this letter.

Camp Titan Learning Outcomes

- A. Interpersonal Interactions: Campers will learn to develop healthy, positive and appropriate interpersonal interactions with adults and peers.
- B. Autonomy and Self-Regulation: Campers will gain a sense of self-regulation over their behavior; they will learn to be independent in their actions.
- C. Conflict Management: Campers will solve problems with others in a constructive manner; they will learn that a conflict is not the end of a relationship.
- D. Confidence: Campers will develop a stronger sense of self.
- E. Nature Education: Campers will learn to appreciate nature and understand interaction of humans with the environment.
- F. Crafts: Campers will build confidence in fine motor skills.
- G. Swimming: Campers will understand the need for safety at a pool.
- H. Canoeing/Lake: Campers will understand the need for safety in water sports.
- I. Ropes Course: Campers will learn teamwork, problem solving and interdependence.
- J. Astronomy: Campers will identify constellations and learn the myths behind them.
