**REPORTS**

**a. Chair**

Kurtz reported the following:

1) Kurtz stated there are only three more committee meetings left this semester and he went over what the committee should expect for the rest of the semester.

- How Credit Affects Your Life: 10/23/2018, 2-4pm in the Grand Stair Studio. A professor has agreed to provide extra credit to their students if they attend. Cristina Medina has been promoting the event. Please spread the word and consider attending yourself.
- Student Art Show: All of the art is displayed in the Center Gallery and the Plaza Gallery. Each committee member needs to go view the art, choose their top four pieces and submit the information to Kurtz by 10/26/2018. On 10/31/2018, the committee, as a whole, will then decide on which art piece they might consider purchasing. The same process will happen at next semester's art show and at the end of the year, the committee will decide which of the two art pieces will be purchased.

- Programming Survey: Kurtz is working with Martin to finalize the survey. It includes nine questions in total. Once the survey link is available, he will email it to everyone so that committee members can have students complete it. The TSCBOT will be tabling at five different events where they will encourage students to complete the survey. Those who complete the survey will have a chance to win a pair of AMC movie tickets. Survey results will be discussed at the 11/14/2018 committee meeting.
- Assessment of Programs: Kurtz has asked each committee member to attend one to two different programs in the SRC or the TSU per month and write up an informal report regarding engagement, attendance and overall thoughts on the program. The reports need to be submitted to Kurtz and he will share them with those in charge of those programs. Future committee meetings will include professional staff who will come and talk about their programs and why they have these programs in order to gain their point of view and perspective on the program.
- Operating Hours: On 10/31/2018, the committee will be reviewing the 2019-2020 TSU and SRC operating hours as well as a proposal to modify the Spring 2019 SRC operating hours.

**b. Director, Titan Recreation**

Tapper reported the following:

- 1) Tapper encouraged committee members to keep bringing ideas to their one on one meetings.
- 2) Tapper is working on a couple of proposals involving the SRC operating hours and outdoor adventure program ideas.
- 3) Tapper is working on bringing updates to the TSCBOT and the committees about the different ideas that have come up like the doors in SRC, Juice it up!, the Intramural Hall of Fame display and other branding ideas.
- 4) Turnstile count analysis at the SRC shows an increase compared to last Fall. There has also been a significant decrease in the fail rate at the turnstiles since the switch from hand scans to the barcode through the app.

**c. Programming Liaison/Trustee, TSCBOT**

Barillas reported the following:

- 1) Barillas has been in contact with ASI Productions and Environmental Sustainability Commission to see if the TSCBOT can table at their events. TSCBOT will be tabling at the events below in an attempt to have students complete the survey:
  - ASIP Wednesday Concert: 11/7/18 12pm to 1pm
  - Environmental Sustainability Commission Events: 10/30/18 & 11/13/18 11am to 2pm
- 2) Barillas has asked Cristina Medina, Information and Services Desk Manager, to provide three years worth of data for the current programs and services that the Information and Services Desk offers in order to see if students utilize these or not.

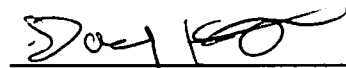
Hesgard announced that the Executive Team has been working on two projects:
